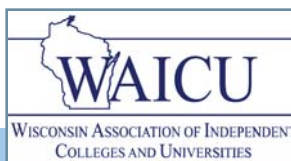
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May will be their first step toward becoming the best nurses they can be.

Activities are primarily directed toward professional development, community involvement, participation in state and national conventions, and National Student Nurses Week. BSNA members host a spring festival each April for the community, coordinate campus blood drives, and work with local non-profits for food, clothing and other collection drives serving those in need.

With the support of the Wisconsin Grant and other sources of financial aid and scholarships, Jenna and Megan have been able to achieve their BSN without a huge financial burden. This helps to make their careers in nursing a reality. "We are very appreciative to have someone back us, and help us achieve our goals," said Jenna.
